




Keynote Speakers

Peter Gall

Peter Gall, currently serving his third year as President of SPANZ. Peter has completed 14 years as Principal of Papatoetoe High School a large multi-cultural co-educational state school in South Auckland. Prior to being appointed Principal at Papatoetoe High School he was Deputy Principal at Papakura High School, Head of Science at Pukekohe High School and taught at Waitara High School in Taranaki for eleven years. As SPANZ President Peter has been actively involved in a number of Ministry of Education Reference Groups as well as many national and international forums.

Dr Bruce Beirsto

Bruce retired in 2009 from the position of Superintendent of School District 38, Richmond, British Columbia.

He has an international reputation as a skilled educationalist and inspires with his insights into management, leadership and learning.

He began his career in Richmond in 1974 at Burnett Junior Secondary School as a Science/Math Teacher.

At both Burnett and Richmond District he was a school administrator, curriculum coordinator for computer technology and held various administrative roles in the Board Office. As an Associate Superintendent he had responsibility for Learning Services and a family of schools.

He has numerous publications to his credit, including: "Imperatives and Possibilities for Multicultural Education"

"Multidimensional Administrative Interaction: A Binocular Model of Simultaneous Management and Leadership"

"Empowering Professionals as Lifelong Learners"

Professor John Hattie

John is Professor of Education at the University of Auckland, Faculty of Education in the Department of Teaching Learning and Development and a Director of both Visible Learning Laboratories and asTTle. He has an international reputation as a researcher and student assessment expert and recognized expert on how to improve children's learning.

His research interests include, measurement models, latent trait models, Structural Equation modeling and Meta-Analysis.

John has published a great number of books and papers including "Visible Learning" A Synthesis of over 800 Meta Analyses Relating to Achievement.

Professor Lisa Lahey

Lisa is Associate Director of the Change Leadership Group at the Harvard Graduate School of Education. Her current professional interests focus on adult development within school districts, and tightly connecting individual development with district-wide goals for improved student performance. Lisa coaches leaders on how to create, facilitate and maintain conditions to support individual, group and organisation development.

A former Principal and High School Teacher, Lisa has taught extensively in graduate school programmes in Boston and in professional development programs. Lisa's first book, "How The Way We Talk Can Change The Way We Work: Seven Languages for Transformation" (co-authored with Robert Kegan,) was published by Jossey Bass in 2001. She earned her M.Ed. and Ed.D. in human development from the Harvard Graduate School of Education.

Hon Anne Tolley

Anne Tolley is Minister of Education and MP for East Coast, a large and diverse electorate which stretches from Gisborne, around East Cape and through to the Whakatane plains.

In 2005 she returned to parliament and was elected Junior Whip, and given the Child, Youth and Family portfolio.

In 2006 Anne was elected Senior Whip, the first woman to hold the position in the National Party. In 2008 she took over the Education portfolio.

Since January 2010, she has been Minister of Education and Minister Responsible for ERO. Her main focus is on implementing the ground-breaking National Standards policy into primary and intermediate schools.

Anne lives in Gisborne with her husband, and has three adult children.
