### Introduction by Chair of the Disciplinary Subcommittee

A suspension is the formal removal of a student from school by the principal under the Education Act 1989.

The disciplinary subcommittee (delegated by the Board of Trustees) then decides the outcome from this suspension meeting. The subcommittee may decide one of the 4 following outcomes:

- 1. lift the suspension without conditions;
- 2. lift the suspension with reasonable conditions imposed;
- 3. extend the suspension with reasonable conditions imposed; or
- 4. exclude or expel the student
